September


NCI Library will be taking part in the following ways:

in the areas of referencing and citations; good academic integrity practices and avoiding
misconduct; and academic writing.

- A raffle will be held where all students who complete <u>Epigeum Academic Integrity Training</u> are eligible for entry; prizes include €100 and €50 One4All vouchers and the winner will be announced during the last week of term (9th -13th December).
- We will man a stand in the Atrium on the morning of Friday the 18th October, where we will be

 students may have.

On the 10th December starting at 12:45pm, we will be offering training to all faculty and staff relating to the Epigeum Academic Integrity programme, as follows:

On registering, you will be asked to enter a token. For staff, this is **ba019bdd**.



1 - Authorship for Investigators

This past May, NCI staff availed of a training session with Turnitin showing participants how to use the new Originality and Authorship tools. This training was quite comprehensive and we recommend that staff who have questions about the use of these features take a look!



2 - Turnitin Summit 2024

Turnitin's 2024 summit, on the topic of how to "Navigate the Age of AI with confidence", was held from the 24th April to the 1st May. Among the useful insights shared during the summit, the "One piece at a

<u>time</u>: <u>Solving the AI writing puzzle</u>" interactive resource may be of particular use to faculty who are struggling to incorporate an awareness of AI into their assessment design and evaluation.





